This one-day conference is designed to deliver an overview of current trends in music therapy in oncology and palliative care settings, focusing on clinical practice and research from multi-cultural perspectives. The role of the music therapist within collaborative and interdisciplinary contexts will be presented with consideration given to the in-depth scope of practice throughout the continuum of illness. The conference will feature descriptions of current innovative practices and demonstrations of strategies that address a range of biopsychosocial and spiritual issues within patient, family and staff environments.
